Today, we're going on a fun Fall Scavenger Hunt around the schoolyard! You'll be searching for different items that remind us of the fall season. Work with a partner or by yourself to find as many things as you can from the boxes below. When you find something, check it off your sheet!

Safety tips:

Don't touch insects, mushrooms, or berries, stay with your group and make sure you can see your teacher or adult at all times and respect nature!

Find a **leaf** that has turned **red** due to fall.

Look for a **leaf** that has turned **yellow**.

Spot a **leaf** that's become **orange**.

Pick up a **leaf** that has turned **brown**.

Look for an **acorn** on the ground or near trees.

A fallen **pinecone** from a tree.

Find a **small stick** or **twig** that has fallen to the ground.

Discover a **seed pod** from a tree (like those from a maple or sycamore).

Spot a **feather** that a bird may have dropped.

Look for a **mushroom** growing in moist, shaded areas.

Observe a **squirrel** in action, gathering nuts or running around.

Try to **spot birds flying in groups**, possibly migrating for the winter.

Step on a dry, **crunchy leaf**.

Touch or observe the **bark of a tree**.

Find a **berry or fruit** on a bush or tree (but don't pick or eat it!).

Look up and find a **cloud in the shape of an animal or object**.

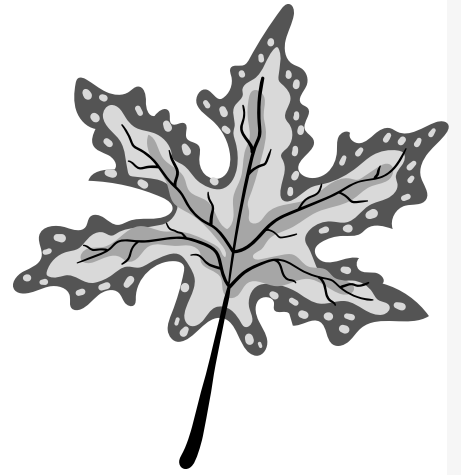
Spot a **grasshopper, beetle, or another insect** before they hide for winter.
